Moorshead publisher Halvor Moorshead says in the debut issue's editorial that he realized there was a need for a genealogy basics magazine when he was sending people to websites like [Cyndi's List](#) for beginner's resources. "We sold plenty of subscriptions to both magazines, but I found that I was continually explaining to new subscribers some real genealogy basics - steering them to Cyndi's List and other places that listed beginner's courses. These people were smart enough, but they just needed something more basic than what we were selling. It was sobering to realize that there might be a big market for a genealogy magazine that dealt with the basics." *Discovering Family History's* editor is Ed Zapletal.

### ***Hoosier Genealogist Connections***

IHS began publishing the award-winning journal *The Hoosier Genealogist (THG)* for members in 1961. It contained indexes and other data that served as keys into rare source material such as diaries, ledgers and public records. In 2000, the journal began to include narrative articles telling how to conduct research and offering rich examples of family and local history written by genealogical experts. In 2007, the name changed to *THG: Connections*, and today, *THG: Connections* is a biannual magazine of in-depth articles with an internet companion, [Online Connections](#), which contains indexes and data.

### ***Traces of Indiana and Midwestern History***

Published by Indiana Historical Society (IHS)  
From 1989 (v.1) To 2020 (v.32)

*Traces of Indiana and Midwestern History* is an award-winning popular history magazine published quarterly since 1989 as a benefit of membership in IHS. Combining interesting narrative and analytical history about Indiana in its broader contexts of region and nation, the magazine has explored the lives of artists, writers, politicians, performers, soldiers, entrepreneurs, homemakers, reformers and naturalists. The department "Black History News and Notes," includes articles on the political, social and cultural history of black people in Indiana, in American history and in the Old Northwest. Material contained in the ***Nutmegger*** is intended to be of such a nature that it retains its value over a span of many years. ***Connecticut Genealogy News***

Published Quarterly by the **Connecticut Society of Genealogists, Inc.**

All issues from 2008 (v. 1, June) To Present (2025, v. 18)

The Connecticut Society of Genealogists, Inc. publishes ***Connecticut Genealogy News***, a quarterly magazine, intended to deliver short, informative articles and news in a light, attractive, illustrated and “fun-to-read” presentation. Topics of Interest to ***Connecticut Genealogy News*** include articles on “Research Aids,” “How-to Articles,” “Connecticut Towns & Cities,” “Genealogical Resources (preferably relevant to CT),” “Genealogical Organizations,” etc. ***Connecticut Genealogy News*** may have an “issue theme,” although not all the articles in a given issue relate to the theme, there may be a set of “lead” articles that do. Recent issues have often had themes that relate to the ethnic groups represented in CT’s population. Typically, these issues contain a set of articles, written independently, but related to by the theme. Lead articles may address some (but not necessarily all) of the following:

(1) researching ancestry in this ethnic group (General); (2) researching ancestry in this ethnic group (Connecticut Specific); (3) The demographic distribution of this group (CT and US); (4) immigration statistics; (5) Brief genealogy (2-3 generations) of a representative CT family.

All issues from 1970 (v. 1) To Present (2025, v. 56)

***Ohio Genealogy News (OGN)*** was published beginning in 1970. It features articles about genealogical records, collections and repositories, research techniques, OGS chapters, and other genealogical news. The content includes: 1) News & People - short blurbs about Ohioans and Ohio organizations in genealogical news, or national genealogical news relevant to OGS members; 2) Feature Articles - topics may describe newly-available record sets (in archives or online), or introduce the genealogy collections of Ohio repositories, and "How-to" articles; 3) Success Stories - this a great place for everyday genealogists (not just the professionals) to share their genealogical journeys or to write about a specific experience you've had breaking through a brick wall, discovering a new ancestor, or getting to know a relative through their personal writings; and 4) Local and Chapter Spotlights.

The ***Ohio Genealogical Society Report*** was published between 1961 and 2002. It was renamed the ***Ohio Genealogical Society Quarterly*** beginning in 2003. OGS Quarterly encourages submissions of all types of material pertaining to people who were born, lived or died in Ohio prior to and including those in the 1940 census. Bible records and other original old manuscripts may be included with a transcript of the record. By including ***Ohio Civil War Genealogy Journal*** and ***Ohio Records & Pioneer Families***, the new OGS Quarterly will have a broader scope covering Ohio genealogy from the earliest settlers in Ohio to the year 1940. We will continue to invite questions on Civil War and all subjects related to genealogy during Ohio's history.

It publishes condensed and sourced family histories; church, cemetery and court records; newspaper abstracts; Bible records; and book notices.

All issues from 1997 (v. 1) To 2012 (v. 16)

The ***Ohio Civil War Genealogy Journal*** was published between 1997 and 2012. This quarterly publication of the Ohio Genealogical Society is designed to help you find more information about your Civil War ancestor, his unit, and the family back at home. Ohio contributed over 300,000 men to the Union, making Ohio the third largest contributor of Union troops. This large number of men combined with the many types of records (many of which were implemented for the first time in the Civil War) makes for a wealth of information about this very important time in American history. Another feature of the ***Ohio Civil War Genealogy Journal*** is queries from the subscribers. Incorporated into the ***OGS Quarterly*** after 2012.
